

APPLICATION FOR JPC GRANT FOR PERIOD 2020 - 2021

After due deliberation following formal interviews conducted by the Grants Committee and subsequent consideration of certain additional records, the JPC has instructed me to inform you all of their final decision, subject to a majority vote conducted by emails in accordance with current HM Gov guidance.

The outcome of the Grant Awards process are as follows; it should be noted that those who did not receive support this year will be asked to apply again in October this year where the process of support will be conducted for the year 2021-2022.

The grants will be paid in TWO tranches, the first within the next 7 days, the second, September this year.





Great news the JPC have been successful in adopting the platforms and some of the surrounding areas of Henley Railways Station. We hope to be in a position to adopt the Railway building later this year. There are plans to make our line into a Shakespeare Heritage Line and to increase the service to half hourly trains and eventually the hope is the line could be connected to other rail links to places like the Cotswolds.

On behalf of the JPC we would like to thank all of the residents who have shown such a great interest in this project so far.


