
Three notable areas to report on County wise are:

I am pleased to say that **The Claverdon Monday Club** asked me to speak about my role as a Councillor and answer some of their questions about various issues. This was the third of three such talks in the space of two weeks, the other two being a presentation on Climate change at **Norton Lyndsey** and an update on County council matters at the **Earlswood Residents Association**. I enjoy these as you never really know what you are going to be asked and so tend to be lively at times.

At last week's Full Council (where all councillors attend) the main issue was a paper on Youth Justice which highlighted the benefits of the approach taken by Warwickshire which has one of the lowest reoffending rates and lock up (imprisoned) rates in the West Midlands and the Country.

As you can see from the next slide the offending population of individual children who have received a substantive outcome in 22/23 shows White males are over-represented, as well as males of Mixed and Black ethnic origin.

Later in the week I attended the Adult Social Care Committee where we received a presentation from Dr Kate Drysdale and other NHS representatives on the Palliative and End of Life Care Strategy. The aim is to improve services, plans and visibility of the availability of these services although worryingly as ambitious as the plan is, which I congratulated them on the strategy as it is full of great initiatives but my question on funding revealed that there is no

new funding for this strategy and that it will have to be funded by using existing budgets. I have no doubt that the strategy is full of great intentions and the dedication of NHS staff but I am concerned about how it is going to be delivered as the inference would seem to be that other areas will find their funding reduced, although I am assuming that frontline medical and surgery services will noy be one of those areas.

In the same meeting we discussed the snappily titled **Sustainable Futures Strategy** before its final consideration by Cabinet over the next couple for months. Primarily concerned with Climate Change and what the County is doing on its own emissions and its plans for the wider area of Warwickshire.

Delivering our net zero Warwickshire target in partnership with the public sector, residents, communities, and business, will result in emission reductions of close to 5,509,000 tCO2e in 2050 from our 2019 baseline following adoption of the fully inclusive greenhouse gas approach. Current national policy measures and technological assumptions project a gap of approximately 3,000,000 tCO2e. Closing this gap is reliant on large scale behavioural change, partnering, technological developments, and change in all sectors accelerated by government, regional and local policy, and significant additional funding. The need for a joined-up approach is illustrated by the 18% contribution that emissions from motorway travel has to Warwickshire's carbon footprint (2019 figures), a network that is the responsibility of National Highways. The need to deliver insetting and offsetting measures may also play a part as full decarbonisation will not be realised in all sectors.

I challenged the report asking whether in the light of Government movement on some targets related to Climate Change whether the report was already out of date but the commitments and targets for Warwickshire are remaining the same, there is no desire to dilute the targets for 2030. This is welcome news.

# Henley in Arden Specific Speed monitoring update

As of today, I have ordered 26 sets of speed monitoring for two weeks in October/November. They will be in Claverdon, Earlswood, **Henley in Arden,** Tanworth in Arden, Ullenhall and Wootton Wawen. I have paid for these from my delegated budget with the aim of getting an accurate picture of speed, volume, and classification around the division. As Henley already have some speed data, we could consider installing monitoring equipment a few weeks after the 20mph zone is in operation to see what difference it has made.

# Other County wide news

Millions of eligible people in England can now book their life-saving autumn COVID-19 vaccine online.

Anyone eligible for the COVID-19 autumn booster can book via the NHS website, by downloading the NHS App, or by calling 119 for free if they can't get online. Those eligible include all those aged 65 and over, pregnant women and those with an underlying health condition. This year's autumn flu and COVID-19 vaccine programmes started earlier than planned in England as a precautionary measure following the identification of a new COVID variant. We are urging people to come forward for their jab as soon as they are invited by NHS England.

To continue to support our residents to reduce their risk of catching and spreading COVID-19 and flu we ask you to share messages encouraging people to:

- Get vaccinated.
- · Wear a face covering in indoor public places.
- If you feel unwell, stay at home, and avoid contact with others.
- Let fresh air in if you are meeting indoors.

#### **Arranging COVID-19 vaccination transport**

Currently this transport can be requested if residents have no other safe way of accessing vaccination sites. This service is based on volunteer availability and limited funding arrangements.
